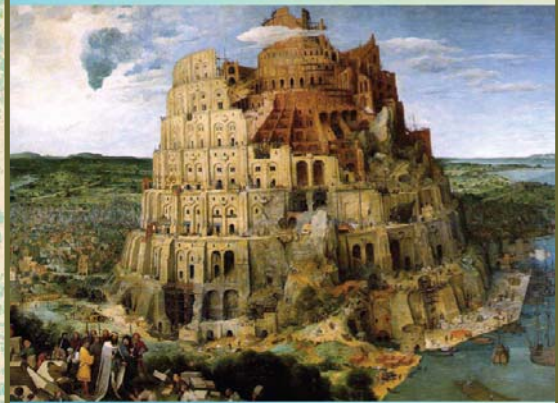
About Judy Klitsner
